Rules

1. All exhibits must be staged by **9.30 a.m.**, judging to commence at 9.45 a.m.
2. All entry forms accompanied by appropriate fees must be sent to the Secretary no later than **Saturday, 1st August 2026.**
3. No exhibit in classes 82 - 136 to have previously been judged at Bowes Show.
4. All exhibits to be the work of the exhibitor.
5. Prizes: Senior classes 1st - £5; 2nd - £3; 3rd - £2, unless otherwise stated. 4th prize of £1 will be awarded if there are 10 or more entries in any class. Junior classes 1st - £3; 2nd - £2; 3rd - £1 unless otherwise stated. 4th prize of 50p will be awarded if there are 10 or more entries in any class.
6. Entry fee Senior classes £1, junior classes 50p per entry unless otherwise stated (see Rule 7, General Rules)
7. All produce is to be cut and sampled.
8. In flower classes, competitors must provide their own bowls or vases.
9. All exhibits to be shown without fancy cloths or baskets, excepting classes 36 - 41 inclusive.
10. At the Committee's discretion classes for children aged 18 years and under on Show Day and Young Farmers may be divided according to age or exhibit type.
11. No exhibits or prize cards can be removed before 4.00 p.m. without written permission from the industrial secretary.
12. **The marquee will be closed at 4.00 p.m.** and only exhibitors will be readmitted to collect their exhibits and prizes.
13. **All exhibits to be cleared by 5.00 p.m.**
14. Any prize money not collected on Show Day will be returned to Show funds.

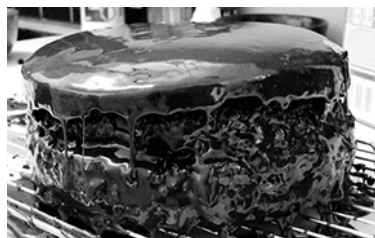

Change to No 8 needles and work for 28 rows in stocking stitch.

Decrease: 1st row: k1(0) k5 k2 together, 8(10) times k1 (0) purl back.

Decrease: 2nd row: k1(0) k4 k2 together 8(10) times k1(0) purl back.

Continue to decrease in this way until 10 stitches remain.

Purl back and break off yarn.

Thread through remaining stitches.

Sew up seam as flatly as possible using running stitch.
